National Backpack Program on Track to Help More Than 2.5 Million Kids Since 2001

Delray Beach, Fla., August 8, 2011 – If you put together all 2.5 million kids that the [Office Depot Foundation](#) has reached through its National Backpack Program since 2001, they would fill up about 50,000 school buses! That’s a lot of kids – and a lot of success stories.

On **Tuesday, August 9**, the Foundation – the independent charitable giving arm of Office Depot® (NYSE:ODP) – will donate 6,000 cool new backpacks in five colorful designs to children served by area non-profit organizations and schools. The Foundation will present the backpacks, which contain essential school supplies, during a special “Back-to-School Celebration” beginning at 10 a.m. at the Office Depot store located at 14539 Military Trail in Delray Beach.

Through the award-winning National Backpack Program, which is now in its 11th year, the Office Depot Foundation will help deserving children prepare for school by donating 350,000 backpacks across the United States and internationally. The newly designed backpacks, which were specially created for the Foundation, reflect and respond to changes in the ways that children are taking their materials to school.

“In keeping with our mission – Listen Learn Care – we’ve created these fun and exciting backpacks in response to what kids have told us they like,” says Foundation President Mary Wong. “We are thrilled to donate these very cool backpacks to more children in a single year than ever before.

In the past five years, Office Depot and the Office Depot Foundation have provided more than 70,000 backpacks and backpacks for kids in Palm Beach County.

“Every year, we have seen our donations bring hope to children whose families might not be able to afford to buy school supplies,” Wong continues. “Parents and teachers alike tell us that we truly are helping children to build self-confidence, boost self-esteem and achieve greater success in the classroom – all as a result of being properly prepared for school.”

To celebrate Feed The Children's national partnership with the Office Depot Foundation, a special tractor-trailer used by the organization to deliver food and school supplies around the nation will be parked at the store during the event.
